Location

The 2003 Winter Camporee will be held at Rum River Scout Reservation near Anoka, MN. Go north on 10/47 or 169 through Anoka. Take 47 north. Rum River Camp is roughly 6 miles north. Watch for signs on the east side



General Information

Event Rules	Scout Oath and Scout Laws
Scoring	Troops, patrols and scouts will be judged on their patrol method, scout spirit and participation. Scout Spirit will be evaluated for tie breakers on skill events.
Check-in	Friday evening, or Saturday morning. See schedule. PLEASE have your campout roster ready at check-in. On site registrations will be handled at check-in or at the Friday night crackerbarrel.
Maps	A map including details and event locations will be distributed at check-in.
Fires	<u>NO GROUND FIRES!</u> Use fire rings or approved above ground units. Troops must provide their own wood.
Garbage	Pack it in, pack it out. No littering will be tolerated!
Latrines	Permanent latrines and portable toilets on site.
Water	Water is available in limited supply. Troops are encouraged to bring their own water.
Parking	Depending on snow cover, troops may be able to access some sites by vehicle for loading and unloading purposes. Vehicles and trailers <u>MUST</u> be parked in the parking lot. <i>All troops should plan on moving gear to campsites by sled.</i>
Clothing	All campers should dress accordingly for the weather and be prepared for changes in the weather.
Klondike Sleds	Units are encouraged to bring a Klondike style sled for Saturday's events.
Downhill Sledding	There is a sledding hill available at the camp. Scouts may bring toboggans or plastic sleds for this hill (Klondike sleds are not allowed on sledding hill areas). This area will <u>not</u> be supervised by camporee staff.
Snow Shelters	If there is sufficient snow at the time of this event, units may build snow shelters in the designated camping areas. If you go out prior to the camporee to prepare your site or shelter, please contact Bob Litke, at Rum River, at 763-427-8340 to let him know you are coming. Snow shelters must be destroyed before checkout on Sunday.
Headquarters	Headquarters will be available as an Emergency Warming Shelter . Units should make attempts to warm their members before coming to the warming shelter. Scouts must be accompanied by a unit adult in the warming shelter and are limited to ¹ / ₂ hour intervals.
1 st Aid	Each troop should be able to care for minor injuries. Major injuries will be attended to by staff. Please have the proper medical paperwork handy for every boy.
Fees	See pre-registration section. Webelos and Cub Leaders are invited at no charge. They should coordinate with and be guests of a troop.

Uniforms	Scout uniforms ONLY. No camouflage or military uniforms. Scouts and leaders are expected to be in full uniform for the evening programs as well as the flag-raising ceremonies.
Order of the Arrow	The Lake Minnetonka Chapter Order of the Arrow has volunteered to provide service by helping staff the morning activities. If you are an Arrowman or a leader, please think about helping out or encouraging anyone interested to help out.
Scout behavior	Scouts will be expected to follow the rules and regulations, and listen to leaders and staff. Anyone not heeding these instructions will be asked to leave the camporee. Remember, Scouting is a safe haven for boys!
Scoutmasters and S	PL's: Please go over this packet with your troop before the Winter Camporee. A copy of the map and event rules may benefit each patrol during the events. Detailed maps and schedules will be distributed at camporee check-in.

Competition Events

Strategy: The Name of the Game! (Sat. a.m. activities)

Description: The morning will be spent in activities designed to help Scouts understand the benefits to working as a team, planning ahead, and being prepared. Scouts will rotate though a series of games and activities, as a troop, that will test their thinking and planning skills against themselves and other troops. Each troop will be given a list of supplies for their Klondike Sleds that may give them the edge in successfully completing these events. These events will be designed so that your ability to think clearly, decisively, and as a group will be more of a benefit than the size of your Troop or your Scouts. Your Troop's performance in the morning activities will carry through to a bonus in the afternoon's strategic mission.

Plan Your Work: Work Your Plan (Sat. p.m. activity)

Description: Following the morning strategy/team building activities, Troops will be given their **orders and mission parameters** for the afternoon activity. At this point, this mission is still top secret and the details must remain undisclosed. However, it will require all of your troop's planning resources and both offensive and defensive cunning and prowess to successfully complete. It will also be a ton more fun than any old sled race!!!

Minnesota Hotdish Cookoff

Description: One of the things that makes a Minnesota winter bearable is the vast variety of hearty hotdishes that we eat. Present your best classic casserole to the judges and prove just how tasty these staples of the Great White North cuisine can be.

Purpose: Use your outdoor cooking skills to make a hot, tasty, nourishing meal.

Objective: The meal will be judged on the following criteria:

Campsite Inspection

Part of scout camping is maintaining a safe and organized campsite. All areas inspected are covered in the Boy Scout Handbook or the BSA Field Manual. Troop campsites will be judged on the following criteria:

I. Campsite Identification

- A. American Flag
- B. Troop Flag
- C. Entryway with troop sign

II.	Campsite and	sleeping	arrangements
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- A. Tents pitched by patrol
- B. Campsite neat and orderly

III. Health, safety and sanitation

- A. Wood tools properly stored
- B. Garbage picked up
- C. Dishes washed and put away
- D. Cooking area clean
- E. First aid kit easily seen
- F. Fire attended or out, cold to touch
- G. Fire plan posted
- H. Fire located in proper area
- I. Fuels properly stored (including liquid fuels)
- J. Food properly stored

IV. Menu planning, Duty roster

- A. Menu for all meals
- B. Duty roster posted

V. Scout Spirit project

Units may gain extra points for useful pioneering projects campsite.
